## SCOPE OF WORK SUMMARY

• **Section 1 Storage Command Class II Solutions (SC2): CSP Operations:**

Scope sourced from draft PWS subject to change. The contractor shall manage and operate the USMC Consolidated Storage Program (CSP) network across approximately 21 geographic locations worldwide (CONUS and OCONUS). Services include item management, accountability, Total Asset Visibility (TAV), warehousing, laundry, repair, inventory management, and total lifecycle management of Individual Combat Clothing and Equipment (ICCE), CBRN-D equipment, STAP, Soft-Walled Shelters and Camouflage Netting (SWS&CN), and Class VIII equipment. The contractor shall utilize GOCO-IT systems (DPAS-WM, SSAVIE, GCSS-MC) and maintain audit readiness per MCO 4400.201. Minimum workforce of 370 personnel; 100% on-site performance required.

• **Section 2 Storage Command Class VII Solutions (SC7): Force Storage Battalion Support:**

Scope sourced from draft PWS subject to change. The contractor shall provide on-site logistical support for 1st Force Storage Battalion (Barstow CA) and 2nd Force Storage Battalion (Albany GA) in the areas of inventory management and control, warehousing, storage, tactical vehicle maintenance, kitting, equipment marking/labeling (pRFID/IUID tagging), and movement of Military Equipment (ME). Support includes Depot Level Repairables (DLR), Operational Materials and Supplies (OM&S), and ME; with options for COSIS, divestment, level 3 maintenance, and surge inventory support. Contractor must maintain 100% weapons inventory accuracy and 98% accuracy for all other equipment.

• **Section 3 Storage Command Business Solutions (SCS): MFSC HQ Business and QA Support:**

Scope sourced from draft PWS subject to change. The contractor shall provide integrated business management solutions, quality assurance, logistics support, and program management support for MFSC Headquarters and the CSP. Services include QA/QC of SC2 operations, strategic business management, facilities operations support, IT support (GOCO-IT), audit readiness (FIAR), inventory management support, and business process improvement/modernization. The SCS contractor is explicitly prohibited from competing for SC2 contracts they support (OCI mitigation per FAR 9.505).

• **Section 4 Distribution Management Support Services (DMSS): Global Distribution Advocacy:**

Scope sourced from draft PWS subject to change. The contractor shall provide distribution management support on behalf of MARCORLOGCOM at CONUS and OCONUS locations, embedding personnel with operational stakeholders to provide subject matter expertise and process advocacy. Services include cargo tracking and tracing, frustrated cargo resolution, container management, Force Deployment Planning and Execution (FDP&E), in-transit visibility, transportation financial analysis, and global



logistics awareness reporting. Personnel are embedded at aerial/seaports, fleet logistics centers, and MEF locations worldwide.

- **Section 5 Coordinated SECREP Management & Strategic Logistics (CSM): Reparable Issue Point Support:**  
Scope sourced from draft PWS subject to change. The contractor shall provide on-site logistics support, coordination, Continuous Process Improvement (CPI), and strategic logistics planning at three MEFs (I, II, III), Marine Forces Reserve, and MARCORLOGCOM. Services include SECREP inventory management at Reparable Issue Points (RIPs), CSM metrics development and reporting, supply chain analysis, Lean Six Sigma process improvement, and strategic logistics services planning. The contractor manages approximately 33 FTEs across Albany GA, Camp Lejeune NC, Camp Pendleton CA, Kaneohe Bay HI, and Okinawa Japan.
- **Sections 69 Task-Specific PWS Areas (IIP, NDTE, COSIS, M2OG):**  
Scope sourced from draft PWS subject to change. Four additional task order areas are defined: Initial Issue and Provisioning (IIP) at III MEF Japan and Kaneohe Bay HI for fielding new equipment to operating forces; Non-Destructive Testing Equipment (NDTE) Operations for scanning and quality control of ESAPI armor plates (requires ASNT NDT Level II certification); Care of Supply in Storage (COSIS) for vehicle exercising, PMCS, battery management, and preservation of combat/tactical vehicle fleets; and Material Management Operations Group (M2OG) support for tracking new equipment fielding from delivery through distribution to operating forces at multiple CONUS/OCONUS locations.
- **Logistics Operational Support (Receipt, Storage & Issue):**  
The contractor will provide logistics operational support including receipt, storage, and issuance of combat-ready capability sets to sustain the expeditionary force. - **Draft Document Included** The primary technical document (MFSC-FMF Multiple Award Contract Overview DRAFT Master PWS, Attachment-1) is explicitly a draft. All fields sourced from this document are unconfirmed and subject to change. Do not treat draft PWS requirements as final solicitation requirements. The Sources Sought Synopsis is the only published solicitation document.
- **Sources Sought Only No Award Will Result** This is a market research notice only. The Government will not award a contract solely on the basis of this Sources Sought Notice and will not reimburse respondents for costs associated with preparing or submitting a response.
- **\$2.5 Billion Aggregate Ceiling Major Opportunity** The Sources Sought Synopsis states the approximate total aggregate value of the MAC IDIQ will be \$2.5B, with individual task orders expected to range between \$5M and \$250M on average. This is a significant long-term opportunity requiring substantial teaming and past performance strategy.
- **10-Year MAC Ordering Period Unusual Duration** The MAC ordering period is 10 years, which is longer than the standard 5-year IDIQ ceiling. Individual task orders are limited to 60-month periods of performance plus a 6-month extension option. Bidders should assess long-term teaming and staffing sustainability.
- **Hybrid Contract Type DCAA Accounting System Required** The required services are to be accomplished under a hybrid cost-reimbursable and firm-fixed-price basis. - **ASNT NDT Level II Certification Required (NDTE Task Area)** Personnel operating NDTE systems for ESAPI plate inspection must possess and maintain a current ASNT NDT Level II certification (or recognized equivalent under NAS 410/EN 4179) in the specific inspection method used.
